Meet Details. The team will host an Intra-squad Meet for the Orange, Blue & Bronze swimmers on Saturday, November 10 at Wheaton College. Warm-ups will be at 11:00 a.m. and the meet will begin at 11:45. This is a great chance for newer swimmers to get their first taste of competition and we encourage ALL Orange, Blue and Bronze swimmers to participate! (Silver swimmers who have not participated in a meet before may also participate).

2. 9&Over 50 free
3. 8&Under 25 fly
4. 9&Over 50 fly
5. 8&Under 25 back
6. 9&Over 50 back
7. 8&Under 25 breast
8. 9&Over 50 breast
9. 8&Under 50 free
10. 9&Over 100 free

Positive Check In. All swimmers will be required to check-in upon arrival to the meet. Positive check in will be located on the pool deck.

Bullpen. A bullpen will be used for all swimmers.

Meet Staff. Parents please be willing to volunteer to time, be a runner, or help with the bullpen! Here is a brief description of the three areas where we will need help:

Bullpen. The bullpen is the holding area for all swimmers commonly used for the 8 and under age groups. The area includes chairs lined up by race heat. Parent volunteers use the heat sheet to organize the group so that they can be marched behind the blocks in the proper meet order. This insures that the younger and less experienced swimmers make it to their events.

Timing. Timing is simply taking a the time of each swimmer using a team issued stop watch. The time is then written on a result sheet that will be on a clip board. This sheet will be collected after every events. All equipment (stop watch, clip board, pencil and result sheet) is issued by the team at the meet. Other then learning how to use a stop watch no special training is necessary.

Runner. Person who collect timing sheets from the times and brings them to the computer result table. A runner may also be asked to hand out meet programs, updates to the coaches as well as posting results by taping them to a wall
